Here, you may write your favourite role model, they could be someone famous or your family member, just be sure to provide justifications. Meanwhile, the thank you portion of the framework is very easy. You will just write a letter giving thanks to the people who have made a difference in your life, or those who have helped you in achieving the accolades that you have. Interviewers definitely want students who are humble and down to earth. That's all, hope you'll heed to these to improve.
