a. Strengths:

- Intriguing magical concept
- Immediate consequences of the spell
- b. Weaknesses: Logical Flow: The connection between the spell and its effects is unclear. The sudden appearance of riches and disappearance of others lacks context and explanation. For instance, "One farmers horse drawn cart was overflowing with riches" doesn't clearly link to the spell's words.
- c. Exemplar: "William whispered the words from the book, entranced. 'Every risk brings wealth or ruin,' he intoned. As the last word left his lips, a crash echoed outside. He saw one farmer's cart suddenly overflowing with gold, while another farmer vanished entirely, illustrating the spell's cruel duality."
- #3: "As he told the truth to Morganne, She started to crumble to dust as William mumbled the truth.

a. Strengths:

- Dramatic resolution of the conflict
- Clear emotional relief for William
- b. Weaknesses: Overexaggeration: The excessive repetition of 'O' in Morganne's cry is distracting and unrealistic. It detracts from the seriousness of the scene. For example, the line "NOOOOOO..." spanning multiple lines breaks the flow of the narrative.
- c. Exemplar: "As William revealed the truth, Morganne began to crumble. 'No!' she cried, her voice fading as her form dissolved into dust. With the threat gone, William finally felt the weight of anxiety lift from his shoulders."
