#1: (First paragraph) a. Strengths:

- Vivid description of the library setting
- Establishes the character's task and initial conflict

b. Weaknesses: Lack of character depth Your writing introduces Wulfric but fails to provide enough depth to his character. For instance, you mention "Wulfric had no clue what to write," but don't delve into his emotions or thoughts about this predicament. This leaves the reader disconnected from the protagonist.

c. Exemplar: "Wulfric's quill hovered uncertainly over the parchment, his mind racing with a mixture of anxiety and determination as he grappled with the weighty task of composing a book for the king."

#2: (Paragraph starting with "Wulfric asked the book...") a. Strengths:

- Introduces a magical element with the enchanted book

b. Weaknesses: Rushed pacing Your writing rushes through significant events without allowing the reader to fully grasp their impact. For example, you quickly move from Wulfric asking the book to take money, to him running to his mother, to observing the consequences. #3: (Final paragraph) a. Strengths:

- Attempts to convey a moral lesson
- Shows the long-term consequences of Wulfric's actions

b. Weaknesses: Underdeveloped resolution Your conclusion feels abrupt and doesn't fully explore Wulfric's realisation or attempts at redemption. The line "Greed is bad" comes across as overly simplistic and doesn't do justice to the complexity of the situation you've set up.

c. Exemplar: "As Wulfric surveyed the devastation his greed had wrought, the weight of his actions crushed him. He realised that true wealth lay not in gold, but in the prosperity and wellbeing of all."

Actionable Task: Rewrite the paragraph where Wulfric first uses the enchanted book, focusing on his internal thoughts and emotions. Ensure you explore his motivations and the gradual realisation of the consequences of his actions.
