#1 (Role model paragraph): a. Strengths:

- Clear identification of a role model

- b. Weakness: Underdeveloped scenario Your ethical dilemma lacks clarity and depth. It's unclear why aiming in handball is considered a moral or ethical issue. The situation you describe seems more like a minor disagreement rather than a significant ethical challenge. For example, you state "my friend said that a lot of people were aiming and he looked pretty annoyed," but you don't explain why this was problematic or how it presented an ethical dilemma for you.
- c. Exemplar: "During a handball game, I noticed some players deliberately targeting weaker opponents. This raised an ethical dilemma for me: should I speak up and risk alienating my teammates, or stay silent and allow unfair play to continue?"

#3 (Diary entry): a. Strengths:

- Creative and imaginative storyline

- b. Weakness: Disjointed narrative Your diary entry, while imaginative, lacks coherence and clear progression. The narrative jumps from one event to another without smooth transitions or adequate explanations. For instance, you abruptly introduce characters like "Nick" and "Dr Emilia" without properly establishing their roles or significance. You

write, "Then I stared through the portal horror piercing my body. The timeline was changing," but don't provide context for this sudden shift in events.

c. Exemplar: "As I peered through the shimmering portal, a wave of horror washed over me. The familiar timeline I knew was unravelling before my eyes, replaced by an alternate history where Hitler's victory in 1917 threatened to rewrite everything we knew."

Actionable task: Rewrite the ethical dilemma paragraph, focusing on a more substantial moral challenge. Ensure you clearly explain the conflicting values or principles at stake and how you ultimately made your decision.
