#1 (INTERVIEWQUESTION): a. Strengths:

- The final message about the journey being the true reward is thoughtful and well-expressed.
- b. Weaknesses: Rushed conclusion The ending feels abrupt and lacks detail compared to the rest of the narrative. You quickly jump from facing your greatest fear to the final realisation without fully exploring this pivotal moment in the story.
- c. Exemplar: "As the visions of greed and cruelty faded, I found myself standing in the cavern, the shattered amulet at my feet. In that moment, I understood the true nature of the treasure not gold, but the wisdom gained through our harrowing journey."
