The transition from her wondering to actually tripping is abrupt and lacks sufficient buildup. The use of "splonk" as a sound effect for tripping feels out of place and detracts from the seriousness of the situation.

c. Exemplar: "Ada wondered if she could trigger the same energy that had taken Zahi. Taking a deep breath, she approached the blue cord. '3... 2... 1...' she counted silently, then deliberately caught her foot on the wire. She stumbled forward, bracing for impact."
