#3: Ending paragraphs a. Strengths:

- Attempts to create a dramatic ending
- Links back to the opening character (Zoey)
- b. Weaknesses: Rushed and Underdeveloped Conclusion Your conclusion feels abrupt and underdeveloped. The sudden death of the salesman and Zoey's reaction seem disconnected from the rest of the story. There's a lack of build-up to these events, making them feel forced rather than a natural progression of the narrative. The phrase

"Zoey balled her eyes" (which should be "bawled") is an example of how the rushed ending leads to errors and unclear imagery.

c. Exemplar: "As the mayor's words echoed across the sombre gathering, Zoey felt a wave of emotion crash over her. The salesman's tragic end had struck a chord deep within her. With tears streaming down her face, she stumbled away from the crowd, her mind in turmoil. Lost in her thoughts, she stepped into the road, unaware of the approaching truck."
