SCINTILLATING SCENTS



The J'adore bottle is as feminine as its fragrance. Taking up the sensual curves of the legendary amphora created by Christian Dior, it is adorned with the famous Maasai necklace, like a jewel dancing on a woman's neck.



Evocative imagery refers to the use of rich, descriptive language and metaphors to create vivid images that transport readers into the world of the scent.

Using vivid imagery helps paint a sensory picture for the reader, transporting them into the world of the scent and allowing them to experience it as if they were there.



EMOTIONAL RESONANCE


Emotional resonance is the process of connecting a scent to universal human emotions and experiences, enabling readers to relate to the scent on a personal level.


JASMINE SAMBAC AND GRASSE JASMINE




COPYWRITING TECHNIQUES

THE POWER OF CONTRAST





The aroma of a rich, full-bodied wine






EXPANDING BEYOND PERFUMERY


