For instance, you mention "creating real-world scenarios for students to practise making good food choices," but you don't elaborate on how this would be implemented or its potential impact.

c. Exemplar: "By offering a carefully curated mix of nutritious options alongside occasional treats, schools can create a controlled environment where students learn to make informed food choices. This approach could involve designated 'treat days' or limited junk food availability, allowing students to practice moderation and decision-making skills that will serve them well beyond the school gates."

#3 (Fifth paragraph): a. Strengths:

- Proposes student involvement in menu planning
- Provides specific examples of how to engage students

b. Weakness: Lack of counterarguments Your paragraph on student involvement in menu planning is compelling, but it doesn't address potential challenges or

counterarguments. For instance, you don't consider how schools might balance student preferences with nutritional requirements or how to ensure diverse dietary needs are met.

c. Exemplar: "While engaging students in menu planning can increase buy-in for healthier options, schools must also consider how to balance student preferences with nutritional guidelines. This could involve creating a student-staff committee that works with nutritionists to develop menus that are both appealing and health-promoting."
