#1 (First paragraph): a. Strengths:

c. Exemplar: "As the frequency and severity of natural disasters increase, the debate over environmental preservation intensifies. While individual actions are crucial, government intervention through effective laws and regulations is equally important in safeguarding our planet for future generations."

#2 (Third paragraph): a. Strengths:

- You acknowledge the importance of personal contributions to environmental preservation.
- You show awareness of the limitations of individual actions.

b. Weaknesses: Underdeveloped ideas Your discussion of personal contributions lacks depth and specific examples. You mention that personal hard work can be effective, but you don't provide concrete examples of what this might entail. #3 (Last paragraph): a. Strengths:

b. Weaknesses: Lack of specific action steps While you propose a collaborative approach, your conclusion lacks specific, actionable steps for implementation. For example, you state, "Small communities can support each other in preserving Mother Nature while large governments could enact laws to save the environment as well," but you don't provide examples of how this collaboration might work in practice.

c. Exemplar: "A harmonious approach to environmental preservation requires both grassroots efforts and governmental action. Communities can initiate local recycling programmes and awareness campaigns, while governments can implement carbon taxation and invest in renewable energy infrastructure. By combining these efforts, we can create a more effective and comprehensive strategy to combat environmental degradation."
