

#1 (First paragraph):

a. Strengths:

- Engaging opening that addresses the audience directly
- Introduces the topic of technology and its impact on society

b. Weakness: Lack of clarity

Your opening paragraph, while engaging, lacks a clear thesis statement. You mention "sharenting" but don't clearly define it or state your position on the issue. This leaves the reader unsure of the essay's main argument.

c. Exemplar:

#2 (Second paragraph):

a. Strengths:

- Attempts to use figurative language to convey the permanence of digital content
- References a relevant human rights document

b. Weakness: Disjointed ideas

Your second paragraph jumps between several ideas without clear connections. You mention digital footprints, then abruptly shift to children's rights without establishing a

clear link. The metaphor about "root of risk" is unclear and doesn't effectively support your argument.

c. Exemplar:

"The digital footprints left by 'sharenting' can last an eternity, creating a permanent online presence for children without their consent. This practice raises important questions about children's rights, as outlined in Article 19 of the UN Convention on Human Rights, which states that everyone has the right to freedom of opinion and expression. I argue that this right should extend to children, allowing them to have a say in what information about them is shared online."

#3 (Fourth paragraph):

a. Strengths:

- Acknowledges counterarguments
- Attempts to provide a solution to the issue

b. Weakness: Underdeveloped argument

Your counterargument and rebuttal lack depth and evidence. You present the opposing view that children are too young to understand technology, but your response doesn't provide concrete reasons or examples to support your position that children can learn and be responsible.

c. Exemplar:

"While some argue that children are too young to understand the complexities of digital technology, this view underestimates their capacity to learn and adapt. By involving children in decisions about their online presence, we can teach them valuable lessons about privacy, consent, and digital citizenship from an early age. This approach not only respects their rights but also prepares them for the digital world they will inherit."

Actionable task: Rewrite your introduction paragraph, focusing on clearly defining 'sharenting' and stating your main argument about its risks and the need for children's involvement in online privacy decisions.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the paragraph about Empathy, focusing on providing specific examples of how this power would enhance your relationships and daily interactions. Ensure you illustrate the contrast between your current experiences and the potential benefits of having empathic abilities.
