- c. Exemplar: "Regular consumption of high-calorie, low-nutrient foods like French fries can contribute to weight gain and, potentially, obesity. This, combined with other factors such as lack of exercise, can negatively impact both physical and mental health."
- #3: "According to RUOK, 3 in 10 depressed people choose to suicide themselves which is really depressing."

a. Strengths:

- Attempts to use a statistic to support the argument
- Tries to link mental health issues to the main topic
- b. Weaknesses: Inappropriate tone and terminology Your use of the phrase "choose to suicide themselves" is insensitive and grammatically incorrect. Additionally, the statistic seems out of context and not directly related to the issue of junk food in schools.
- c. Exemplar: "Studies have shown that poor nutrition can contribute to mental health issues. For instance, research published in the British Journal of Psychiatry found that teenagers who consumed more junk food were 79% more likely to suffer from depression."
