#1 (First paragraph): a. Strengths:

For instance, you begin with a description of a morning stroll, then abruptly shift to discussing littering and smoking, before concluding with a broad statement about individual actions. This lack of focus makes it challenging for the reader to grasp your main argument.
- c. Exemplar: "As you take your morning stroll, you witness a stark contrast: on one side, community members diligently picking up rubbish and planting trees, while on the other, individuals carelessly littering and smoking. This juxtaposition highlights the critical role our individual actions play in sustaining a healthy planet."

#2 (Third paragraph): a. Strengths:

- Provides a specific example to support the argument
- Attempts to quantify the impact of individual actions
- b. Weaknesses: Overgeneralisation Your writing makes sweeping statements without sufficient evidence or nuance. For example, you claim that "individual actions are more crucial when addressing climate change" without considering the role of governments or industries. The example of "every single Australian" picking up rubbish is an oversimplification of complex environmental issues.
- c. Exemplar: "While individual actions alone may not solve climate change, they play a crucial role in addressing environmental issues. For instance, if even half of all Australians committed to picking up one piece of rubbish daily, it would result in over 13 million pieces of waste being properly disposed of each day, significantly reducing pollution in our communities."

#3 (Fourth paragraph): a. Strengths:

- Attempts to link individual actions to broader corporate responsibility
- Recognises the interconnectedness of individuals and organisations

b. Weaknesses: Logical Fallacy Your argument that "corporations are made up of individuals" oversimplifies the complex relationship between individual actions and corporate behaviour. This reasoning falls into the fallacy of composition, assuming that what is true of the parts must be true of the whole. Corporate decisions are influenced by numerous factors beyond individual employees' personal environmental views.

c. Exemplar: "While corporations are indeed composed of individuals, their environmental impact is often driven by complex factors such as profit motives, industry regulations, and market pressures. However, individuals within these organisations can influence corporate policies through advocacy, ethical consumerism, and choosing to work for environmentally responsible companies."
