

#1 (First paragraph): a. Strengths:

- You effectively introduce the main topic of climate change and its urgency.

b. Weaknesses: Clarity and Focus Your opening paragraph lacks a clear thesis statement and jumps between ideas without a strong logical flow. This sentence is vague and doesn't clearly connect to your main argument.

c. Exemplar: "While individual actions like recycling are commendable, systemic changes implemented through global policies and treaties have a far more significant impact on combating climate change."

#2 (Third paragraph): a. Strengths:

- You provide concrete examples of individual actions to reduce carbon footprint.
- You effectively contrast individual efforts with global emission statistics.

b. Weaknesses: Evidence and Support Your argument lacks specific data to support your claims. You state, "Those efforts form a small percentage, not enough to outdo huge corporations and the bulk of population." However, you don't provide any quantitative evidence to back this assertion.

c. Exemplar: "According to a 2021 study by Climate Action Tracker, while individual actions can reduce personal carbon footprints by up to 25%, they account for only 5% of the global emissions reduction needed to meet climate goals."

#3 (Fourth paragraph): a. Strengths:

- You use an analogy (speeding) to illustrate your point about legal enforcement.
- You provide a real-world example (China's EV Policy) to support your argument.

b. Weaknesses: Coherence and Development The transition between the speeding analogy and the China EV Policy example is abrupt. You don't fully explain how the analogy relates to climate action or how it connects to the policy example.

c. Exemplar: "Similar to how traffic laws ensure road safety, environmental policies like China's EV mandate create a structured framework for reducing carbon emissions, proving more effective than relying solely on individual conscience."

Actionable Task: Rewrite your opening paragraph, focusing on crafting a clear thesis statement that outlines your main argument about the superiority of systemic changes over individual actions in addressing climate change.
