3. "'Well, Mr.... Mozart,' the principal said hesitantly, 'our soccer team could use a coach. How about it?' Mozart, still dazed, found himself nodding in agreement. He had no idea what 'soccer' was, but he was eager to find a place in this strange new world. EXEMPLARS:

2. Anachronism: Blend of 18th-century character in a contemporary setting
3. Metaphor: Using music as a metaphor for soccer and teamwork
4. Montage: Quick scenes showing the team's improvement over time
5. Foreshadowing: Hints about Mozart's potential return scattered throughout
6. Dramatic Irony: Readers know Mozart's true identity while characters remain unaware
7. Parallel Plot: Mozart's personal growth alongside the team's improvement
8. Red Herring: False clues about how Mozart might return home
9. Climax: The championship game serves as the story's peak
10. Full Circle: The story ends with a scene mirroring the opening, but with changes showing growth

1. Anachronism: Something or someone that is not in its correct historical or chronological time
2. Harmony: The combination of simultaneously sounded musical notes to produce chords and chord progressions having a pleasing effect
3. Tempo: The speed at which a passage of music is or should be played
4. Adaptation: The action or process of adapting or being adapted
5. Unconventional: Not based on or conforming to what is generally done or believed
6. Synchronisation: The action of causing a set of things to occur at the same time
7. Crescendo: A gradual increase in loudness in a piece of music
8. Bewildered: Perplexed and confused; very puzzled
9. Perseverance: Persistence in doing something despite difficulty or delay in achieving success
10. Camaraderie: Mutual trust and friendship among people who spend a lot of time together
