#3 (Conclusion): a. Strengths:

- Attempts to summarise main points
- Reiterates thesis statement

b. Weaknesses: Lack of depth Your conclusion restates your main points without providing deeper insights or a call to action. For instance, you write, "It is easy to see that systemic changes are the best way to make sure that the world of tomorrow will not

be like the example in the first paragraph." This statement lacks the depth and nuance expected in a conclusion.

c. Exemplar: "While individual actions play a role in addressing climate change, the evidence clearly shows that systemic changes are more crucial. By implementing comprehensive policies, incentivising sustainable practices, and holding large-scale polluters accountable, we can create a more significant and lasting impact on our environment. It's time for governments and corporations to lead the charge in this global fight against climate change."
