a. Strengths:

b. Weaknesses: Redundancy Your writing repeats the same idea multiple times, which dilutes the impact. The phrases "They were real", "It wasn't just a myth", and "It is read and genuine" all convey the same message, making the paragraph feel repetitive and less engaging.

c. Exemplar: "When Lily saw the flickering lights in the distance, she knew the rumours about the old lighthouse were true. If only she hadn't disobeyed her mum and snuck in to explore, she wouldn't be hanging on for dear life."

#2: "It was the end of the school day and crowds of commuters and school children flock the streets and cars occasionally zoom by. The air was full of the humid air of summer while the whitish-golden ball of light started to sink into the azure horizon. A serpentine concrete path spiralled around the city. The fumes of death gyrated around her and wafted into the stale polluted air."

a. Strengths:

- Vivid sensory details that create a strong atmosphere
- Interesting use of figurative language

b. Weaknesses: Tense inconsistency Your writing switches between past and present tense, which can be confusing for the reader. "It was the end of the school day" is in past tense, but "crowds of commuters and school children flock" suddenly shifts to present tense.

c. Exemplar: "It was the end of the school day, and crowds of commuters and school children flocked the streets as cars occasionally zoomed by. The humid summer air enveloped everything while the whitish-golden sun began to sink into the azure horizon."

#3: "Lily had lost her father on this beach. She couldn't remember him but she knew that her father burnt to death in this one building. She still can't visualise her father but she

could clearly remember that fateful day. People ran from the sparks and dived into the water. It was clear but that was all she remembered."

a. Strengths:

- Provides crucial backstory that explains Lily's motivation
- Creates emotional depth for the character

b. Weaknesses: Logical inconsistency Your writing contradicts itself regarding Lily's memory of the event. You state that she "couldn't remember him" and "can't visualise her father", but then say she "could clearly remember that fateful day". This inconsistency makes it difficult for the reader to understand Lily's perspective.

c. Exemplar: "Lily had lost her father on this beach. Though she couldn't remember his face, the chaos of that fateful day was seared into her memory - people running from sparks, diving into the water. She knew her father had burned to death in this very building."

Actionable task: Rewrite the opening paragraph, focusing on maintaining a consistent tense and eliminating redundant phrases. Ensure that each sentence adds new information or moves the story forward.

#1: Introduction a. Strengths:

- You effectively introduce the topic of children's privacy on social media.

b. Weaknesses: Lack of Coherence Your opening paragraph jumps between ideas without a smooth transition. For instance, you mention "embeds embarrassment" and then abruptly shift to discussing the effects on younger generations. This makes it challenging for the reader to follow your argument.

c. Exemplar: "In today's digital age, children's privacy is increasingly at risk due to parents sharing personal moments on social media. This practice, often done without

consideration of long-term consequences, can have lasting negative impacts on a child's well-being and future prospects."

#2: Main Body (Paragraph 3) a. Strengths:

- You introduce the term "sharenting" to describe the issue.
- You provide a specific example of how social media posts can affect future employment.

b. Weaknesses: Underdeveloped Arguments While you introduce important points, such as the impact on future employment, you don't fully explore or substantiate these claims. For example, you mention "digital foot prints" but don't explain how these specifically affect employment prospects.

c. Exemplar: "Sharenting creates a digital footprint for children before they can consent. For instance, a seemingly innocent bath-time photo could resurface years later during a job search, potentially influencing an employer's perception of the candidate and jeopardising their professional opportunities."

#3: Conclusion a. Strengths:

- You restate your main argument clearly.
- You emphasise the long-term consequences of the issue.

b. Weaknesses: Lack of Depth Your conclusion is brief and doesn't effectively summarise the key points from your essay. It also introduces a new idea about "detrimental effects" without providing specific examples or tying it back to your previous arguments.

c. Exemplar: "In conclusion, the practice of parents sharing their children's personal moments on social media can have far-reaching consequences. From potential impacts on future employment to the psychological stress of constant online exposure, it's clear that children's right to privacy must be protected. As society becomes increasingly digital, it's crucial that we establish guidelines to safeguard the online presence of our youngest members."
