#1 Opening Paragraph Strengths:

- Strong emotional impact through vivid sensory details like "tears of dread" and "aroma of dismal"
- Effective setup of conflict with the billboard reveal

Weaknesses: Overuse of Modifiers —> Your writing relies heavily on descriptive words that sometimes detract from the impact, particularly in phrases like "colourful Venice Beach Boardwalk" and "colossal, mall, filled with gaunt and soulless crowds." #3 Resolution Strengths:

- Clear sequence of events leading to resolution

Weaknesses: Rushed Conclusion —> Your ending moves too quickly from conflict to resolution, particularly in "The affluent man was petrified at the sight of this and was forced to cancel his plans." The victory feels too easy and immediate.

Exemplar: "As the crowd grew, their voices rising in unified protest, the developer's confident demeanour began to crack. Days of persistent community action finally forced him to reconsider his plans."
