Section 1:

#1 Opening Paragraph: Strengths:

- Strong sensory details with the "crackle, crackle" sound effect
- Effective establishment of setting and character

Weakness: Overuse of exclamation marks —> Your opening uses three exclamation marks in quick succession ("awesome!", "friends!", "different."), which reduces their impact and makes the tone feel forced.

Exemplar: "The wind whipped through his hair as he executed a perfect kickflip. This was his favourite spot to skate and hang out with friends."

#2 Campaign Development (Paragraphs 7-10): Strengths:

- Good progression of events
- Natural dialogue integration

Weakness: Underdeveloped scene transitions —> Your transitions between events feel rushed, particularly from "The next day" to "Weeks went by." You could strengthen the connection between these moments to show how the campaign gradually gained momentum.

Exemplar: "As word spread, their campaign grew. Local artists joined Mia in creating murals, while street performers and vendors eagerly shared their boardwalk stories."

#3 Resolution (Final three paragraphs): Strengths:

- Clear resolution
- Emotional satisfaction

Weakness: Rushed conclusion —> Your ending moves too quickly from conflict to resolution, with phrases like "As the plans for the mall began to fall apart" lacking specific details about how this happened.

Exemplar: "After months of community pressure and media attention, the developers withdrew their plans. When the mayor announced the boardwalk's protected status, their victory felt earned."

Actionable Task: Rewrite the campaign development section (paragraphs 7-10), focusing on showing the gradual build-up of support through specific examples and stronger transitions between events.
