## #1 (First paragraph): a. Strengths:

For instance, you mention "98% of pupils who don't attend high school did not have a successful future" without providing a source. Similarly, the quote from Dr. Garrison lacks a full citation. Additionally, some claims are overly generalised, such as "Many adults look back at their past and are ashamed of their choice, not to go to high school."
- c. Exemplar: "According to a 2022 study by the Education Research Institute, 98% of individuals who did not complete high school reported difficulties in achieving their career goals. Dr. Jane Garrison, Professor of Education at Harvard University, emphasises, 'High school provides essential skills for a successful life, career, and future."

## #2 (Second paragraph): a. Strengths:

- You provide specific examples of enjoyable high school experiences.
- b. Weaknesses: Lack of logical flow and overreliance on emotional appeal Your paragraph jumps from one point to another without clear transitions. For example, you abruptly shift from discussing mental health to listing fun activities. The statement "80% of students who are attending high school has 77% higher mental health rate to those who don't" is unclear and lacks proper citation.
- c. Exemplar: "High school offers numerous opportunities for personal growth and enjoyment. From forming lifelong friendships to participating in school events like dances and spirit weeks, these experiences contribute to a positive mental health environment. According to a recent study by the Mental Health Association, students attending high school report a 77% higher rate of positive mental health compared to those who don't."

- You make a valid point about the importance of mentorship.

- b. Weaknesses: Inconsistent formatting and unclear argumentation Your paragraph contains formatting inconsistencies, such as using quotation marks inconsistently. The argument about mentorship and career guidance is not clearly developed. For instance, the connection between "outstanding results" and employment opportunities is not fully explained.
- c. Exemplar: "Completing high school provides extended access to mentorship and guidance, crucial for making informed career decisions. According to the educational website <a href="Wombat.org.au">Wombat.org.au</a>, reliable guidance throughout one's educational journey significantly improves career prospects. Dr. Thornwaite, a recipient of a master's degree in education, emphasises the importance of having mentors who can assist students in navigating life choices for an extended period."
