Strengths:

- Introduces an interesting character detail
- Adds local colour to the scene

Weaknesses: Dialogue Punctuation  $\rightarrow$  Your dialogue lacks proper punctuation marks and capitalisation. The sentence structure makes it difficult to distinguish between the spoken words and the dialogue tag.
