## Section 1:

#1 - Opening Scene (First two paragraphs) Strengths:

- Effective establishment of setting and character through Rick's workspace
- Strong emotional hook with the mission cancellation revelation

Weaknesses: Character Development  $\rightarrow$  Your portrayal of Rick feels abrupt and one-dimensional. "Space really was his life" doesn't fully develop his passion or motivations.

Exemplar: "As Rick entered NASA, his sanctuary for the past decade, excitement coursed through his veins at the prospect of the upcoming mission. The sudden cancellation announcement felt like a physical blow."

#2 - Conflict Development (Middle paragraphs) Strengths:

- Good internal conflict presentation through sleepless night

Weaknesses: Plot Structure → Your transition between Rick's dejection and seeking maternal advice lacks sufficient development. The shift feels rushed and needs more emotional foundation.

Exemplar: "That night, as Rick tossed and turned, the weight of choosing between his life's passion and Earth's future pressed heavily on his mind. At dawn, he found himself at his mum's doorstep, desperate for guidance."

#3 - Resolution (Final paragraph) Strengths:

- Creative solution incorporating both space and environmental concerns
- Clear resolution to the central conflict

Weaknesses: Conclusion Development  $\rightarrow$  Your ending feels rushed with the "6 months later" time jump. The implementation of Rick's solution needs more detail.

Exemplar: "Six months later, Rick watched with pride as his eco-friendly mission launched, knowing that each mile into space meant another hundred trees taking root on Earth."

Actionable Task: Rewrite the middle section focusing on Rick's internal struggle, adding specific details about how he arrives at his realisation through his mother's wisdom.
