#1: First answer about school offerings Strengths:

- Demonstrates passion and commitment through specific examples like piano playing since age four
- Shows initiative by suggesting innovative programs like ice hockey and wellbeing hub

Weaknesses: Run-on sentences \rightarrow Your response contains multiple ideas compressed into single sentences, making it difficult for interviewers to follow your key points. For instance: "Sport wise I have a great passion for ice hockey which is not a very common sport in Australia, but it is a great sport for your self-confidence, teamwork, leadership and especially general strength and stamina."

- Provides specific details about teachers and programmes
- Shows genuine enthusiasm for learning through personal connections

Weaknesses: Informal tone \rightarrow Your response includes casual language that doesn't match the formality expected in scholarship interviews. The phrase "Science is the best because" and "lots of the same interests" could be more professionally expressed.

Exemplar: "I particularly value Science under Mr Watts's guidance. His extensive experience as a scientist, engineer, and professional sailor brings real-world applications into our lessons, making the subject both engaging and practical."

- Shows clear career aspirations with the Air Force Cadets
- Demonstrates financial awareness through investment plans

Weaknesses: Lack of cohesion \rightarrow Your response jumps between different ideas without clear transitions. The shift from Air Force Cadets to stocks and hedge funds needs smoother connection.

Exemplar: "While pursuing my primary goal of excellence in the Air Force Cadets, I plan to develop my financial literacy through studying investments and funds, ensuring I build a strong foundation for my university education and future career."
