Section 1:

#1 (Opening paragraph): Strengths:

- Effective establishment of character through physical description
- Creates intrigue with the mysterious mill setting

Weaknesses: Inconsistent Tone \rightarrow Your opening switches rapidly between drowsiness and excitement, creating a jarring effect. "Rick's eyes were drooping" followed immediately by "a sense of excitement jolted through him" creates emotional whiplash without proper transition.

Exemplar: "Rick trudged along the street, his exhausted eyes barely focusing on the path ahead. But as he approached the towering black gates of the mill, a weathered poster caught his attention, promising work and wages. Despite his fatigue, a flutter of hope stirred within him."

#2 (Interview scene): Strengths:

- Good use of dialogue to move the plot forward
- Effectively portrays the interviewer's suspicious demeanour

Weaknesses: Rushed Development \rightarrow Your scene moves too quickly from interview to hiring without building tension. The abrupt "All right you're hired!" lacks believability and misses opportunities for character development.

Exemplar: "The woman barely glanced at Rick's list of accomplishments, her mould-spotted sleeve brushing the desk as she reached for a stack of papers. 'You'll do,' she muttered, stamping a form with unsettling efficiency. 'Start tomorrow. Early.'"

#3 (Discovery scene): Strengths:

- Creates tension through gradual revelation
- Good use of mystery elements with disappearing workers

Weaknesses: Underdeveloped Resolution \rightarrow Your ending rushes through the crucial revelation and resolution. The discovery of the "scarlet book" to Rick becoming "famous and honour" happens too abruptly without emotional weight.

Exemplar: "His hands trembling, Rick flipped through the scarlet book, each page revealing more horrifying details about the workers' fates. The weight of responsibility pressed down on him as he reached for his phone."

Actionable Task: Rewrite the discovery scene (when Rick finds the book) focusing specifically on building tension through sensory details and internal monologue. Include at least three physical sensations Rick experiences as he uncovers the truth.
