#1 (What can you offer our school?) Strengths:

- Shows enthusiasm for creative writing and storytelling
- Demonstrates community involvement through environmental initiatives

Weaknesses: Limited concrete examples → Your response focuses mainly on general statements about storytelling without providing specific examples of your writing achievements or how you would contribute to school activities.

Exemplar: "In six years, I aim to be studying English Literature at university while developing my creative writing skills. My particular interest in fantasy literature, especially stories about dragons, will help me bring unique perspectives to my academic studies."
