Strengths:

Phrases like "loves his new food" and "opened the restaurant's door" feel flat and miss opportunities for engagement.

#2 "He watched her eat the very first bite, he hoped she would give positive feedback. 'Does it taste like w...e...1...1...?' Rich asked with a hand quivered. The costumer use a dangerous eye to look at him and answered"

Strengths:

- Good attempt at showing character emotion through physical description
- Creative use of ellipsis to show nervousness

Weaknesses: Awkward Dialogue Construction \rightarrow Your dialogue formatting needs improvement, with issues in speech tags and unclear character reactions. The phrase "use a dangerous eye" creates confusion rather than tension.

Exemplar: "He watched anxiously as she took her first bite. 'How... how does it taste?' Rich asked, his hands trembling. The customer fixed him with an intense stare before responding."

Strengths:

Exemplar: "After preparing nearly a thousand sandwiches that night, Rich was exhausted. 'If you can't serve faster, I won't return!' a customer snapped, leading others to leave in frustration."
