#1: (Opening paragraph) Strengths:

- Engages readers with an enthusiastic, conversational tone
- Creates intrigue by highlighting the unique cultural fusion

Weaknesses: Dialogue Format \rightarrow Your interview segment lacks proper formatting and contains inconsistent capitalisation and spelling. For instance, "INterseing" and "MAn" disrupt the professional tone of your reporting.
