#1: Opening Paragraph Strengths:

- Evocative imagery with "blistered hands" and "torn bills" creates emotional impact
- Effective use of parallel structure contrasting humans and robots

Weaknesses: Underdeveloped Hook \rightarrow Your opening relies heavily on emotional appeal without establishing the core argument about UBI. The rhetorical question "Would you like this to happen to you?" could be more impactful if connected directly to the solution you're proposing.

Exemplar: "As automation threatens millions of jobs worldwide, families struggle to make ends meet. Their blistered hands tell a story of hard work that may soon be obsolete - unless we implement universal basic income as a safety net."

#2: Second Paragraph Strengths:

- Clear presentation of statistical evidence (1.7 million jobs)
- Strong cause-and-effect reasoning

Weaknesses: Limited Development \rightarrow Your argument about job replacement needs more specific details about how UBI would address this issue. The connection between robots replacing jobs and your proposed solution remains implicit rather than explicit.

Exemplar: "With 1.7 million jobs already lost to automation, implementing UBI would ensure that displaced workers maintain their dignity and purchasing power while transitioning to new opportunities."

#3: Third Paragraph Strengths:

- Personal anecdote about friendship adds human element
- Clear connection to emotional impact of job loss

Weaknesses: Structure Flow \rightarrow Your transition "Secondly" introduces a new point without fully developing the previous one. The friendship narrative, while touching, needs stronger ties to the economic argument for UBI.

Exemplar: "Beyond economic security, UBI preserves the social fabric of our communities. When workers lose their jobs to automation, they often lose vital social connections - but with UBI, they can maintain these relationships while seeking new opportunities."

[Furthermore, implementing universal basic income worldwide is crucial as job losses often lead to the dissolution of friendships and social connections.] Imagine being accepted for a new job and you are unable to make new friends. Until, someone confronts you and asks you to be their friend. Since then, you two have been best friends until robots overtake all jobs and leave humans poor. This is why I believe that universal basic income should be implemented worldwide.
