

## Section 1:

### #1 First paragraph: Strengths:

- Engaging opening with a vivid vision of a pollution-free world
- Effective use of rhetorical questions to maintain reader interest

Weaknesses: Missing Context and Development → Your opening paragraph introduces recycling but rushes through its definition. The phrase "recreating the whole entire world" needs more development to connect with your main argument. The transition between introducing the concept and calling readers to action feels abrupt.

Exemplar: "Imagine a world without pollution or climate change. This future is within our reach through recycling - a powerful process that transforms used materials like paper and plastic into new, useful items. Every time we recycle, we take one step closer to this cleaner, healthier world."

### #2 Second paragraph: Strengths:

- Clear connection between recycling and environmental impact
- Good use of scientific backing to support claims

Weaknesses: Vague Supporting Evidence → Your paragraph mentions scientists but doesn't provide specific details about how recycling reduces pollution. The phrase "Let's just stay positive" interrupts the flow of your argument without adding substance.

Exemplar: "Scientists have shown that our planet is warming at an alarming rate due to human activities. By recycling, we prevent materials from entering landfills, which directly reduces pollution in our oceans and air. Each item we recycle contributes to cleaner water, fresher air, and a cooler planet."

### #3 Third paragraph: Strengths:

- Makes recycling accessible by breaking it down into simple steps
- Creative suggestion of making recycling fun through gamification

Weaknesses: Oversimplification of Impact → Your statement "It only takes like 10 minutes a day" minimises the complexity of recycling's impact. The repeated use of phrases like "super duper quick" could undermine the seriousness of your message.

Exemplar: "Recycling requires minimal effort but yields significant results. By dedicating just 10 minutes daily to properly sorting materials like paper and metal, you contribute to lasting environmental change. Make it enjoyable - turn your recycling bin into a basketball hoop and watch your positive impact grow with every successful shot."

Actionable Task: Rewrite your second paragraph focusing on providing specific examples of how recycling reduces pollution, and include at least two concrete ways that recycling helps combat climate change.
