

Radio Program Transcript: "Brazilian Carnival in Mongolia"

[Sound effect: Samba music playing in the background, drums beating softly.]

Host (Carlos):

The music gets faster, the lights get brighter, and the whole place feels alive! You can even hear the galloping of horses in the background, adding to the magic of the night."

[Sound effect: Horses galloping softly, samba music getting louder.]

Carlos:

"It's an amazing mix of two very different cultures, all coming together in one big celebration of life. It's

proof that no matter where you're from, music and dancing can bring us all together. what a special moment!"

[Sound effect: Samba music fades out.]

Carlos:
