#1 (First paragraph): Strengths:

- Effective use of imagery to create a compelling vision of a better future
- Strong thesis statement that clearly outlines three main arguments

Weaknesses: Leading with hypotheticals \rightarrow Your opening relies heavily on abstract scenarios without grounding them in concrete reality. The phrase "Imagine where the world is green and safe" could be strengthened by connecting it more directly to present-day concerns.

Exemplar: "Our world stands at a crossroads: we can choose between a future of rising pollution and waste, or one where sustainable practices like recycling preserve our environment, improve public health, and create new opportunities."

#2 (Third paragraph): Strengths:

- Effectively connects multiple environmental issues to show cause-and-effect relationships
- Good use of rhetorical questions to engage readers

Weaknesses: Paragraph cohesion \rightarrow Your ideas jump between different topics without smooth transitions. The shift from "live for a very long time" to discussing various diseases needs stronger connecting elements to guide readers through your reasoning.

Exemplar: "The connection between recycling and public health is clear: when we reduce pollution through recycling, we decrease the environmental factors that contribute to serious health conditions like asthma and other respiratory diseases."

#3 (Fourth paragraph): Strengths:

- Clear economic argument linking environmental action to job creation
- Effective use of rhetorical question to emphasise benefits

Weaknesses: Development of ideas \rightarrow Your discussion of job creation through recycling initiatives needs more specific details. The phrase "environmentally friendly recycling job or team" could be developed with concrete examples.

Exemplar: "The recycling industry offers diverse employment opportunities, from collection and sorting specialists to sustainability consultants, providing meaningful work while protecting our environment."

Actionable Task: Rewrite the third paragraph focusing specifically on one health impact of recycling, and develop this single connection thoroughly with clear cause-and-effect reasoning.
