### Section 1:

### #1 (First paragraph) Strengths:

- Powerful use of imagery that creates an emotional impact through vivid descriptions
- Effective contrast between the struggling poor and wealthy individuals

Weaknesses: Underdeveloped argument structure → While your emotional appeal is strong, you introduce multiple scenarios without fully developing their connection to UBI. For example, "filthy rich millionaires, wasting hundreds of thousands of dollars" would be more impactful if directly linked to how UBI could address this disparity.

Exemplar: "While millions struggle to afford basic necessities, the stark inequality in our society is evident as the wealthy spend frivolously. UBI offers a solution to bridge this devastating economic divide."

## #2 (Third paragraph - health argument) Strengths:

- Clear cause-and-effect relationship between income and health outcomes
- Practical example using hospital statistics

Weaknesses: Insufficient evidence development  $\rightarrow$  Your argument about hospital costs needs more specific connections. The phrase "prevent more than half of these people not in hospital" makes an unsupported claim without explaining how UBI would directly reduce hospital visits.

Exemplar: "By ensuring access to nutritious food through UBI, we could significantly reduce diet-related health issues, thereby decreasing the burden on our healthcare system and improving public health outcomes."

# #3 (Fourth paragraph - gender inequality) Strengths:

- Multiple distinct points about UBI's impact on gender dynamics
- Strong focus on practical applications

Weaknesses: Limited paragraph cohesion  $\rightarrow$  Your points about gender inequality, while valuable, jump between ideas without smooth transitions. The shift from "redistribute care between genders" to "separate care receiving from caregiving" needs more connection.

Exemplar: "UBI's impact on gender equality is multifaceted: it helps redistribute care responsibilities between genders whilst providing economic independence, thereby challenging traditional patriarchal norms and empowering vulnerable individuals in the workforce."

### Section 2:

#1 People struggling on the streets, desperation glimmering in their eyes. Begging for money just so they can afford to barely cat enough. [They beg for money merely to afford the barest sustenance.] Obese men, waddling like penguins in the streets with serious health issues. UBI will help accomplish better mental health, gender inequality and helping victims of domestic violence.

#2 My first argument is [that] UBI can help with health. Many people that don't earn enough money can't get good quality and healthy food. #3 Furthermore, UBI can prevent gender inequality. One case could be UBI can help redistribute care between genders by reshaping patriarchal gender norms around paid work and unpaid care. UBI can also help separate care receiving from caregiving, which can help recognise [recognise] interdependency socially. UBI is also capable of providing a safety net for people to leave

exploitative employment. It can also give vulnerable individuals bargaining power over their employers.

Finally, UBI can help victims of domestic violence. Many people have relied on one another but once they have a big fight and go seperate [separate] ways, it will be harder. Thus, a universal basic income come [can] provide the support individuals need to get them out of domestic abuse relationships sooner.
