#1 (First paragraph): Strengths:

- Your emotional appeal effectively creates a vivid picture of poverty

#3 (Third Reason paragraph): Strengths:

Weaknesses: Limited Development → The impact on future generations needs more specific examples. The phrase "safe and healthy future" is too general and doesn't paint a clear picture of the benefits.
