Section 1:

Strengths:

Strengths:

- Your description of the supernatural force builds tension
- Your pacing creates urgency in the scene

Weakness: Repetitive character name \rightarrow You use "Lucas" three times in close succession, which makes your writing sound choppy.

Exemplar: His hands were magnetically pulled towards the map, and as they were engulfed, the force spread to his legs. He tried to scurry to the sea, but the mysterious document was relentless, draining away his strength.

#3: "He recalled the Daily Newspaper, the headlines talking about the mysterious reappearance of a man lost 23 years ago, in the exact same shore he was in. That was the present. Lucas was in the past."

Strengths:

- Your twist ending adds intrigue to the story
- Your connection between past and present is clever

Weakness: Rushed revelation \rightarrow The newspaper memory feels sudden and needs more build-up to have greater impact.

Exemplar: As darkness closed in, a recent newspaper headline flashed through his mind - one he'd read just that morning about a man's mysterious reappearance after 23 years, on this very shore. With horrifying clarity, Lucas understood: that was his future, and this was his past.

■ Your supernatural story has an interesting premise about time travel and fate. You could deepen the emotional impact by showing Lucas's feelings and thoughts throughout his experience. Consider adding more details about how the mysterious jar affects his senses and his growing realisation of being trapped in time.
