#1 (First paragraph about helping the homeless) Strengths:

- Shows genuine care and practical thinking by partnering with established organisations
- Demonstrates understanding of sustainable solutions through involving local businesses

Weakness: Limited Development of Implementation Steps \rightarrow Your response touches on working with the Salvation Army but needs more specific details about how you would coordinate with them. The phrase "structure and programs to establish" could be expanded to outline concrete steps and timelines.

Exemplar: I would collaborate with the Salvation Army to establish a local soup kitchen, creating a detailed 6-month implementation plan including volunteer recruitment, food safety training, and community outreach programmes.

#2 (Second paragraph about shelters and jobs) Strengths:

- Holistic approach considering multiple aspects of support
- Forward-thinking by including employment opportunities

Weakness: Underdeveloped Job Placement Strategy \rightarrow Your mention of "asking renowned companies" needs more detail about how you would convince these companies to participate. The phrase "perfect jobs catered to each individual" requires more specifics about job matching processes.

Exemplar: We would create partnerships with local businesses through a structured employment programme, offering skill assessments and training to match individuals with suitable positions in participating companies.
