WRITING PIECE 1 - FEEDBACK

Section 1:

#1: "She felt the ridges of the map she was carving and wondered if the storms below still whispered secrets to those who dared listen."

Strengths:

- Vivid sensory details through tactile description of map ridges
- Creates intrigue through metaphorical connection between storms and secrets

Weakness: Limited context establishment \rightarrow Your opening line, while poetic, leaves readers uncertain about the setting and character. The phrase "storms below" needs grounding in a specific place or time to help readers understand the world you're building.

Strengths:

- Clear stakes established through the artefact's importance

Weakness: Passive voice construction \rightarrow Your use of "is almost upon" distances readers from the action. The phrase "could save the village" needs more emotional weight to show why this matters to your character.

Exemplar: With trembling hands, she uncovered the final clues leading to the ancient artefact - her village's last hope for survival.

#3: "The oil-fracking company could potentially get all the oil located in her country, which would leave her village in financial ruin."

Strengths:

• Clear antagonist introduction

• Strong environmental and social themes

Weakness: Underdeveloped conflict → Your presentation of the oil company needs more specific details about their actions. The phrase "could potentially get all the oil" feels too vague to create tension.

Exemplar: The ruthless oil-fracking company had already begun drilling at the village borders, their machines threatening to destroy both the land and the ancient secret buried beneath it.

Your story could benefit from clearer connections between the map, the artefact, and the oil company's threats.

Actionable task: Rewrite the opening paragraph focusing on establishing a stronger connection between your character's map-carving skills and her emotional ties to the village.

Section 1:

- Your opening line creates immediate intrigue through vivid imagery
- Your use of dramatic irony effectively draws readers in

Weakness: Limited context \rightarrow While your opening line is captivating, you don't build upon the alien setting or explain what "the one thing they feared most" refers to. The sentence stands alone without connecting to the rest of your narrative.

Exemplar: In the soft glow of the alien sunset, the crowd gathered around the intricate sculpture, their gasps of wonder turning to whispers of horror as they realised it bore the unmistakable mark of their greatest fear - creativity.

#2 "Alice lives in the dystopian society, where all creativity is looked down upon and is chastised." Strengths:

- Your introduction of the main conflict is clear
- Your establishment of the dystopian setting is direct

Weakness: Telling rather than showing \rightarrow You simply state the society's stance on creativity instead of revealing it through details or examples. The phrase "looked down upon and is chastised" could be more specific about how the society responds to creativity.

Exemplar: In Alice's world, blank walls stretched endlessly through identical streets, while security drones hunted for any trace of individual expression.

#3 "Soon Alice creates artworks of all media, always ignoring the many bruises she bore from chastisement, and hence she starts the Dystopian Renaissance." Strengths:

- Your ending shows character growth
- Your concept of a "Dystopian Renaissance" is unique

Weakness: Rushed development \rightarrow You jump to the conclusion without showing Alice's journey. The phrase "creates artworks of all media" needs more detail about her artistic evolution and how she sparked this renaissance.

Exemplar: Despite the welts on her back, Alice's hands moved with growing confidence across canvas, clay, and stone, each piece of forbidden art inspiring whispered conversations of change throughout the grey city.

■ Your narrative presents an engaging premise about creativity in a dystopian world. You need to develop the alien setting you hint at in your opening line, as this unique element disappears from the story. Try to show how Alice discovers different art forms gradually rather than suddenly becoming proficient in all media. Your story would benefit from more details about how other citizens react to her art beyond just punishment. Consider adding dialogue to bring your characters to life. The concept of a Dystopian Renaissance deserves more exploration of how art begins to change your society.

Actionable task: Rewrite the middle section of your narrative focusing on one specific artwork Alice creates, showing both her creative process and the varied reactions it provokes from different members of society.

Strengths:

- Shows cultural connection maintenance

Weakness: Surface-level discussion \rightarrow Your answer touches on watching the show but doesn't explore the deeper meaning of this tradition in maintaining cultural ties and family relationships.

Through watching Axing's food tours, we not only spend quality time together but also keep our connection to Chinese culture alive. It sparks conversations about our family history and helps me understand my parents' experiences growing up in China.

#3 "The conditions were horrible, and she was bullied because of how thin she was. But she kept on studying, which brought her to a good university in the city."

Strengths:

- Shows clear admiration for mother's resilience
- Provides specific details about challenges faced

Weakness: Incomplete connection to personal impact \rightarrow Your response could better link your mother's experiences to specific ways they have shaped your own approach to difficulties.

My mother's journey from facing bullying to achieving academic success teaches me that persistence pays off. When I struggle with difficult subjects or feel discouraged, I think about how she overcame much bigger obstacles.
