WRITING PIECE 1 - FEEDBACK

Section 1:

#1 "Anna Karenina, a middle-class woman with beautiful brown hair and shining blue eyes lived in Moscow with her husband and two kids." Strengths:

- Clear introduction of the main character with vivid physical description
- Establishes the setting and family context efficiently

Weakness: Character background lacks depth \rightarrow Your opening focuses mainly on physical appearance without showing Anna's personality or inner world. The phrase "beautiful brown hair and shining blue eyes" tells us how she looks but not who she is.

Exemplar: Her hands trembling with both excitement and nervousness, Anna made her way to the barn, where her collection of woodcarving tools waited to help bring her dreams to life.

#3 "Many days later, the map was finished, but when the man who wanted the map failed to pick it up, the family's spirits dropped" Strengths:

- Creates a turning point in the story
- Shows the impact on the whole family

Weakness: Underdeveloped conflict resolution \rightarrow Your ending feels rushed and doesn't fully explore the emotional impact. The phrase "the family's spirits dropped" doesn't show how this affects their future plans or Anna's dreams.

Exemplar: After weeks of dedication, Anna completed the intricate map, but as days passed with no word from the commissioner, she watched her family's dreams of Mediterranean adventures slowly fade away.

■ Your narrative shows promise in creating an interesting character with unique skills and dreams. However, you could deepen the story by exploring Anna's relationship with woodcarving earlier in the tale. Try showing how this skill has helped her cope with her sea longing before the map opportunity arrives. Add more details about her family's reaction to her passion for both the sea and woodcarving. Your ending needs more resolution - perhaps show how Anna's artistic talent might still open new doors for her family. Give your readers a stronger sense of hope or learning from this experience.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the final paragraph focusing on how Anna uses this disappointment to strengthen her family bonds and pursue her artistic dreams in a new way.

Section 1:

Strengths:

- Strong opening that creates an immediate sense of mystery
- Vivid imagery that sets the scene effectively

Weakness: Limited Development of Setting \rightarrow Your opening focuses heavily on the sculpture but gives little context about the world where this takes place. Phrases like "alien sunset" and "thing they feared most" need more background to help readers understand the setting.

Exemplar: In the eerie purple glow of Earth's transformed sky, the crowd gathered outside the National Museum gasped at the intricate sculpture, their faces reflecting the same terror carved into the stone family before them.

#2: "Surprisingly, the FBI didn't state this information in their press conference. It was called The Nightmare as the sandstone that the sculptor used was black, as if stained with coal."

Strengths:

- Creates tension through government secrecy
- Effective use of symbolism with the black sandstone

Weakness: Underdeveloped Plot Elements \rightarrow Your mention of the FBI press conference feels rushed without sharing what they did say. The naming of the sculpture needs more connection to the plot.

Exemplar: The FBI's press conference carefully avoided mentioning the alien fingerprints, focusing instead on the sculpture's unique black sandstone composition - a material that seemed to absorb light like a cosmic void.

Strengths:

- Beautiful metaphor with the snow description
- Shows character motivation

Exemplar: The light snow provided perfect cover - fewer visitors would be at the museum, giving Michael the chance to examine the sculpture up close without drawing attention.

The jump from the sculpture's discovery to Michael's investigation needs more bridging details. Consider adding more about why Michael specifically is interested in investigating, and what makes him qualified or motivated to do so. You've created interesting elements with the FBI cover-up and the alien fingerprints - these could be expanded to build more tension.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the paragraph introducing Michael, focusing on establishing his specific connection to the alien presence and his reasons for distrusting the FBI's official story.

Strengths:

Weaknesses: Vague description → The nature of these "deep conversations" needs more detail. What topics do you discuss? How have these conversations strengthened your family bonds?

These car rides give us space to discuss everything from school challenges to future dreams, helping me understand my parents' wisdom while sharing my own thoughts openly.

#3 "The reason he inspires me is because he has great discipline, he's caring, loving, happy and always loves me."

Strengths:

- You show clear admiration for your father
- You list multiple positive qualities

Weaknesses: List-like structure \rightarrow Instead of simply listing traits, develop how these qualities manifest in your father's actions and their impact on you.

My father's discipline shows in how he maintains a demanding career while never missing my basketball games, demonstrating that true care means consistently showing up for those you love.
