Section 1:

Section 1:

- Your opening immediately creates an atmospheric setting

Weakness: Limited context of the setting \rightarrow Your opening plunges readers directly into the scene without establishing the world or its inhabitants. The mention of "alien sunset" suggests a different world, but readers need more details about where and when this takes place.

Exemplar: In the soft glow of the crimson alien sunset on the desert planet of Nexus, the crowd of settlers gasped at the intricate crystal sculpture

#2: "The Shadow was something so malevolent people could not bear to describe it, as it seemed to not have a corporeal form." Strengths:

- Your creation of mystery around the antagonist
- Your use of supernatural elements adds intrigue

Weakness: Vague characterisation \rightarrow Your description of the Shadow relies too heavily on telling rather than showing. While you mention it's malevolent, you don't provide specific examples of its evil actions or impact on the world.

Exemplar: The Shadow, a being whose mere presence had withered entire forests and turned lakes to ash, defied description as it shifted between forms like smoke in the wind

- Your build-up of tension
- Your effective use of sound imagery

Weakness: Rushed climax \rightarrow Your reveal happens too quickly after the build-up. The transition from celebration to horror needs more development to achieve its full impact.

Exemplar: The statue's surface fractured with a metallic groan, splitting along invisible seams to reveal the writhing horrors that had waited patiently within its bronze depths
