#### Section 1:

#1: First paragraph Strengths:

- Vivid sensory details with the map carving and storm imagery
- Strong establishment of the setting and stakes

Weakness: Limited character background development → While your writing creates atmosphere, Sarah's personal history and motivations remain unclear. The mention of "A'lars" and her quest appear suddenly without context about why she's there or her connection to this place.

Exemplar: Before tracing the ridges of her carved map, Sarah recalled the day she first arrived in A'lars, when its harsh winds had nearly broken her spirit - but nothing could stop her search.

#2: Second paragraph Strengths:

- Emotional depth in describing father-daughter relationship
- Effective use of sensory details with "caffeine-infested breath"

Weakness: Abrupt transition  $\rightarrow$  Your shift from memories to the Black Guard lacks smooth connection. The jump from warm memories to "He was taken, not lost" feels sudden, leaving readers struggling to follow the emotional thread.

Exemplar: The memory of his caffeine-scented hugs made her chest tighten with determination - she would face the Black Guard's storms to bring those moments back.

#3: Final paragraph Strengths:

- Creates tension through internal conflict
- Strong emotional stakes in the climax

Weakness: Rushed resolution setup  $\rightarrow$  Your build-up to the choice feels hurried. The questions pile up quickly without giving readers time to feel the weight of each option Sarah faces.

Exemplar: Sarah's hands trembled as two paths stretched before her: step from the shadows and face the Guard, or remain hidden and watch her father fade forever.

■ Your narrative shows promise in building an intriguing world with emotional depth. Consider developing the relationship between the setting and characters more fully. The land of A'lars needs more concrete details to feel real and threatening. Try showing how the harsh environment shapes Sarah's choices and personality. Your story would benefit from slowing down key moments to let readers connect with Sarah's journey. Give more space to explore her feelings about each discovery and decision she makes.

Task: Rewrite the third paragraph focusing on Sarah's physical journey to the trial location, incorporating specific details about A'lars that reflect her emotional state.

## Section 1:

# Strengths:

- Your opening line creates immediate intrigue through the contrast between beauty and fear
- Your use of sensory details with "soft glow" sets a vivid scene

Weakness: Limited Context Setup  $\rightarrow$  Your opening line, while captivating, leaves too many questions unanswered early on. What is "the one thing they feared most"? Setting up the core conflict needs more groundwork.

#2: "To the understanding of the settlers, the Chthonic Deities were disgraces; their culture drowning in lies and absurd myths. Minka was the last descendant of her kind, and she knew the truth."

### Strengths:

- Your development of cultural conflict adds depth
- Your character's unique position as the last descendant creates emotional investment

Weakness: Underdeveloped Background  $\rightarrow$  Your introduction of the Chthonic Deities feels sudden. The conflict between settlers and deities needs more build-up to help readers understand the stakes.

The settlers had long branded the Chthonic Deities as outcasts, their sacred traditions dismissed as dangerous myths. As the last of her kind, Minka carried the burden of truth - her people's artistry had always celebrated life, not destruction.

#3: "Minka's heart pounded. She had wanted them to realise the potential of her tribe's beauty, but now that was at the cost of exposing her."

## Strengths:

• Your portrayal of internal conflict is compelling

• Your use of emotional tension drives the story forward

Weakness: rushed emotional progression  $\rightarrow$  Your character's feelings jump from observation to crisis without showing the build-up of her fear and hope.

Minka's heart thundered against her ribs as she watched the crowd's reaction. Her dream of showing them her people's beauty had transformed into a nightmare that could expose everything she was.

■ Your narrative explores themes of prejudice and cultural misunderstanding with potential for deeper impact. Consider developing the background of both societies more fully before the sculpture reveal. The conflict between preservation of heritage and fear of the unknown needs more exploration through Minka's perspective. Show more of her daily struggles living among people who fear her kind. Add details about previous incidents that shaped the settlers' fears.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the scene where Minka creates the sculpture, focusing on her emotional connection to her heritage and her hopes for bridging the cultural divide.

Score: 42/50

Weaknesses: Lack of specific impact → The description of how this mindset affected later life situations is missing. You mention "fight that extra round" but don't provide concrete examples of when you actually applied this lesson.

Exemplar: "This mindset has helped me push through difficult situations like completing my Duke of Edinburgh expedition despite the heavy rain, and leading my debate team to victory even when we were behind."

#2 (Board Game Night tradition): Strengths:

- Warm, personal tone
- Shows family bonding through regular activity

Weaknesses: Limited depth  $\rightarrow$  The response stays surface-level without diving into how this tradition has shaped your character or relationships. You mention "support each other" but don't show how this translates beyond game night.

Exemplar: "Through our weekly game nights, I've learned valuable lessons about grace in defeat and humility in victory, which have helped me become a better team player at school."

#3 (Sister's inspiration): Strengths:

- Uses specific achievement (scholarship) as evidence
- Shows clear admiration and impact

Weaknesses: Missing personal growth  $\rightarrow$  While you list qualities you admire in your sister, you don't fully explore how you've applied these lessons in your own life.

Exemplar: "Inspired by my sister's discipline, I developed a structured study routine that helped me improve my maths grade from a C to an A last term."

■ Your responses would benefit from more specific examples showing how these family influences have directly impacted your actions and decisions. Try to include at least one concrete situation for each answer where you applied the lessons learned. You could expand your answers

by describing the lasting effects these experiences have had on your relationships and personal development.
