#### Section 1:

### Section 1:

Weakness: Limited context  $\rightarrow$  Your opening sentence leaves readers wondering about crucial background details. While mystery is good, we need some grounding in who "they" are and what they fear most. The sentence could benefit from establishing more context about the setting and characters

Exemplar: In the soft glow of Nocholon's alien sunset, the crowd of indigenous settlers gasped at the intricate sculpture, unaware it was created by the Earthlings - the very beings whose arrival had once brought war to their world.

#2 "The stone sculpture on the ground, an intricate series of arches and spirals, had been hailed as an enigma. Its smooth, unnatural edges shimmered in the dimming light, reflecting the viridian glow as if it were alive." Strengths:

- Vivid description of the sculpture's physical features
- Strong imagery with the reflection detail

Weakness: Underdeveloped significance  $\rightarrow$  Your description focuses mainly on physical appearance without delving into why this sculpture matters to the plot. The mention of it being "an enigma" needs more development to show its importance to the story.

Exemplar: The stone sculpture lay embedded in the soil - its intricate arches and spirals forming not just art, but a warning message from Earth. Its smooth, unnatural edges pulsed with an inner light, reflecting the viridian glow in a way that made Zeko's heart race with recognition.

- Creates tension through internal conflict

#2 "Setting up the tree with my dad and sister is a tradition I truly cherish. It's one of those yearly moments that bring us all together."

# Strengths:

- You capture the emotional significance of the tradition
- You provide specific details about roles

Weakness: Limited reflection on personal growth  $\rightarrow$  While you describe the activity well, you could explore how this tradition has shaped your relationships or personal development. The phrase "bring us all together" could be developed to show deeper meaning.

Exemplar: "This yearly tradition of decorating the tree has taught me the value of family bonds and creating shared experiences. Each ornament tells a story of our growth together, making this more than just a holiday activity."

#3 "She helps me out figure out my problems and encourages me to keep doing any good things."

# Strengths:

- You show genuine appreciation for your mother
