Section 1:

#1: "You'll never make it, Angela!... The applications end in two days!" Strengths:

- Strong emotional tension through dialogue
- Clear establishment of conflict between mother and daughter

Weakness: Limited context of Angela's backstory \rightarrow Your opening dialogue jumps directly into conflict without giving readers understanding of Angela's passion for marine archaeology. Phrases like "finally be the second member" need more context about her family's connection to the sea. I wished to follow in Father's footsteps as a marine archaeologist ever since I was young. Mother's words stung, but they couldn't dampen my determination to apply to the underwater archaeology programme.

#2: "That foreboding night... like the squall itself." Strengths:

- Vivid weather imagery
- Effective use of simile with the dog and stick comparison

Weakness: Unclear sequence of events \rightarrow Your paragraph moves too quickly from Angela leaving home to being caught in the storm. Phrases like "supernatural map she had carved" and "ocean calling her name" need better connection to show how she actually reached the dangerous waters. The storm grew fiercer as I followed my hand-carved map towards the shipwreck site. Each flash of lightning illuminated the churning waves that threatened to overwhelm my tiny boat.

#3: "Angela found herself... than coins and jewels themselves." Strengths:

- Meaningful resolution with family photos
- Good emotional payoff connecting to earlier conflict

Weakness: Rushed ending \rightarrow Your conclusion moves too quickly from finding the chest to resolution. The phrase "instantly made her discovery part of her application" doesn't show how this adventure changed her relationship with her mother. Mother held the old family photos in trembling hands. For the first time since Father's death, I saw tears of joy in her eyes as she helped me complete my application.

■ Your story has a compelling premise about following one's dreams despite family opposition. However, you need to develop Angela's determination more clearly throughout the narrative. The

early scenes would be stronger if you showed why underwater archaeology means so much to her. The middle section needs better pacing to build tension during the storm sequence. The ending would be more satisfying if you explored how finding the chest helped heal the rift between mother and daughter.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the scene where Angela discovers the chest, focusing on her emotional reaction to finding family photos and how this discovery helps her understand her mother's fears.

Section 1:

#1 (Opening paragraph): Strengths:

- Strong descriptive imagery of the sunset setting
- Effective use of dramatic introduction with the mayor's announcement

Weakness: Underdeveloped scene setting \rightarrow Your opening lacks details about the location and crowd's composition. The phrase "on the cusp of a noble, hallowed cliff face" leaves readers wondering about the specific features of this important setting.

Exemplar: The mayor stood proudly before the gathered townspeople, his voice carrying across the ancient cliff edge as the golden sunset painted the sky. "Behold, the Orb of the Cliff, a ball of beauty and technology!" he announced, drawing thunderous applause from the mesmerised crowd.

#2 (Middle section with the elder): Strengths:

- Good tension building through dialogue
- Nice contrast between the mayor's panic and elder's dismissal

Weakness: Character depth lacking \rightarrow Your dialogue between the mayor and elder feels rushed. The phrase "Even with his small, green, fragile body deceiving his gifted brain" comes suddenly without prior context about the elder's appearance or personality.

#3 (Climax and resolution): Strengths:

- Good pacing with countdown creating tension
- Clear resolution with community cooperation

Weakness: Rushed ending \rightarrow Your conclusion moves too quickly from crisis to celebration. The phrase "the city hosted a festival to celebrate" needs more development about how the people's attitudes changed.

Exemplar: As the orb disappeared into the misty forest below, a wave of relief swept through the crowd. The same citizens who had doubted their mayor now gathered around him with grateful smiles, planning a celebration that would honour their unity in the face of danger.

■ Your narrative has an interesting premise about trust and community cooperation. The countdown creates good suspense, but you could strengthen the story by developing the relationships between characters more deeply. The sudden shift from disbelief to helping the mayor needs more details to feel natural. Try adding more scenes showing how the townspeople gradually come to believe the mayor's warnings. Your description of the city environment is colourful but could be better connected to the story's events.

Actionable task: Rewrite the scene between the mayor and elder, focusing on their established relationship and adding specific details about past events that would make the elder's dismissal more impactful.

- Personal anecdote about swimming shows resilience
- Clear example demonstrates family support

Weakness: Limited reflection on learning \rightarrow Your response focuses mainly on describing what happened but lacks deeper thoughts about how this experience changed you. When you mention "I still enjoy and participate in swim squads today", you could explore more about what skills or values you gained from persisting.

Exemplar: Through this experience, I learned that initial struggles are normal, and with persistence and family support, I can overcome challenges and even grow to love activities that once seemed impossible.

#2 "Our family is Filipino, and one of the traditions that we do is blessing our relatives..." Strengths:

- Detailed description of cultural tradition
- Clear connection between family and faith

Weakness: Surface-level cultural discussion \rightarrow Your response describes the blessing tradition but doesn't share why it matters to you personally. When you mention "blessing is a sign of respect", you could dig deeper into how this tradition shapes your relationships with family members.

Exemplar: This blessing tradition has taught me the value of humility and strengthened my bond with older relatives, as each interaction reminds me of our shared heritage and family values.

#3 "The person in my family who has inspired me the most is my mum..." Strengths:

- Specific examples of mother's influence
- Clear connection between mother's actions and personal learning

Weakness: Limited specific scenarios \rightarrow Your response gives general statements about your mum helping in "hard times" but doesn't share specific moments that show these qualities. When you mention she "helps me learn from my mistakes", you could include a memorable example.

Exemplar: When I struggled with a difficult maths project last term, my mum sat with me every evening, helping me break down the problems step by step while encouraging me to find solutions independently.

■ Your responses show genuine appreciation for your family and culture. To make your answers stronger, try to share more specific examples and explain how these experiences have shaped your thoughts and actions today. For each point you make, ask yourself "why does this matter to me?" and include your thoughts about it. This will help readers better understand your personal growth through these family experiences.
