### WRITING PIECE 1 - FEEDBACK

### Section 1:

#1: "The sun beamed onto the boiling asphalt as Lucas gazed at something odd. It was a jar which lay in emerald, green grass sprung from the moist dirt." Strengths:

- Your vivid sensory details create a strong opening scene
- Your use of specific colours adds visual depth

Weakness: Limited scene development  $\rightarrow$  Your opening could better establish the setting and Lucas's initial reaction. The transition between spotting the jar and picking it up feels rushed. Phrases like "something odd" are vague when you could build more suspense.

Exemplar: The scorching sun beat down as Lucas trudged along the empty street, his footsteps faltering at the sight of an unusual glint in the grass. There, nestled in the emerald blades, a mysterious jar caught the sunlight.

#2: "The scientists spent hours decoding, researching and just when they were about to crack the code something bizarre happened. The letters on the paper glowed a cerulean as it levitated saying out the phrase" Strengths:

- Your build-up of tension through the scientists' work
- Your creative use of supernatural elements

Weakness: Underdeveloped plot progression  $\rightarrow$  Your transition from research to supernatural revelation happens too quickly. The phrase "something bizarre happened" tells rather than shows the event unfolding. The scientists' reaction needs more detail.

Exemplar: The scientists huddled around the ancient text, their tired eyes straining after hours of analysis. Suddenly, a soft blue glow began pulsing from the cryptic letters, casting eerie shadows across their stunned faces as the paper slowly rose into the air.

#3: "However, the scientist's greed was too much to control him from not snatching the paper and ran towards it, but it went into Lucas and surprisingly Lucas now had an uncontrollable anger." Strengths:

- Your inclusion of character motivation through greed
- Your plot twist with the power transfer

Weakness: Character emotion development  $\rightarrow$  Your portrayal of the scientist's greed and Lucas's transformation feels rushed. The sudden change in Lucas's personality needs more emotional build-up to feel believable.

Exemplar: The scientist's eyes darkened with desperate hunger as he lunged for the glowing paper, but before his trembling fingers could grasp it, the manuscript dissolved into brilliant light and surged towards Lucas. A searing heat flooded through Lucas's veins as rage began to cloud his thoughts.

■ Your story has an engaging premise and creative supernatural elements. To enhance your narrative, try developing your characters' emotional journeys more deeply. Focus on showing their reactions and feelings through their actions rather than stating them directly. Consider slowing down key moments to build tension and suspense.

Actionable task: Rewrite the scene of Lucas discovering the jar, focusing on his emotions and thoughts as he approaches it. Include at least three specific details about his physical reactions and internal feelings.

### WRITING PIECE 2 - FEEDBACK

### Section 1:

#1 "Every evening the stars above the village seemed to flicker for one minute and turn back on as the villagers ate dinner." Strengths:

- Creates an intriguing magical atmosphere
- Establishes a clear time setting and routine

Weakness: Limited sensory details → Your opening could benefit from more vivid descriptions of how the stars looked when they flickered. The current description feels basic and misses the chance to draw readers in with rich imagery of this unusual event.

Exemplar: Every evening, as families gathered for dinner, the countless stars dotting the inky sky above the village dimmed to a ghostly flicker before blazing back to life exactly one minute later.

#2 "And this time the looked outside and told Liam there was nothing wrong with the stars however there was." Strengths:

- Shows conflict between Liam's perspective and others
- Creates mystery around the star phenomenon

Weakness: Unclear character reactions  $\rightarrow$  Your portrayal of the family's response feels rushed. You mention they "looked outside" but don't show their specific reactions or emotions when dismissing Liam's concerns.

Exemplar: His parents and sisters peered through the window, shaking their heads with tired sighs. "The stars look perfectly normal, Liam," his mother said firmly, though he could see the same strange dimming that occurred every single evening.

#3 "The patterns changing and even this weird flicker showed to him that it is possible to transform your destiny." Strengths:

- Links the star phenomenon to deeper meaning
- Shows character growth through symbolism

Weakness: Underdeveloped theme  $\rightarrow$  Your connection between the flickering stars and Liam's desire for change needs more development. The jump from observing stars to believing in destiny feels sudden.

Exemplar: Each evening, as he watched the stars fade and reignite, Liam felt a spark of hope grow within him. If even the eternal stars could change their patterns, surely he too could break free from his family's cycle of poverty.

■ Your story presents an interesting concept about hope and change through supernatural elements. To make it stronger, try adding more details about how Liam feels when no one believes him and what specific changes he wants to make in his life. You could also build up the mystery of the stars more gradually to keep readers curious about what's really happening.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the middle section focusing on the family's dinner scene - include specific dialogue exchanges between Liam and his family members, their facial expressions, and Liam's inner thoughts as he tries to convince them about the stars.

## Section 2:

#1 Every evening the stars above the village seemed to flicker for one minute and turn back on as the villagers ate dinner. [the stars above the village flickered for precisely one minute before blazing back to life as the villagers gathered for their evening meal.]

#2 As normal one evening Liam glanced at the sky noticing this change. [Liam glanced at the sky, immediately spotting the familiar change.] As he went inside to tell his family he braced because [because,] no matter how many times he told them they wouldn't [they would not] believe him. And this time the looked outside and told Liam there was nothing wrong with the stars however there was. [This time, they looked outside and insisted nothing was wrong with the stars, though Liam knew otherwise.]

#3 The stars meant nothing more to everyone lesse [else] than beautiful sparking [sparkling] objects millions of light years away. However, with Liam they represented change. Liam and his family were always poor, and we [he] wanted to change. The patterns changing and even this weird flicker showed to him that it is possible to transform your destiny.

### **INTERVIEW**

#### Section 1:

#1 (Being a good student response) Strengths:

- Shows good understanding of respect towards peers and teachers
- Demonstrates awareness of social boundaries and limits

Weaknesses: Underdeveloped points  $\rightarrow$  Your response about participating in group discussions needs more details about how it makes you a good student. The statement "A good student helps me and other people to have a good relationship" is unclear and circular.

Exemplar: Being a good student means actively participating in group discussions by sharing ideas respectfully and listening carefully to others' viewpoints. This helps build positive relationships with classmates and teachers.

#2 (Unfair treatment response) Strengths:

- Shows empathy and takes action against discrimination
- Demonstrates responsibility by involving teachers when needed

Weaknesses: Limited solutions  $\rightarrow$  Your response focuses mainly on inviting excluded students to play but could explore more ways to address unfair treatment. The phrase "(unless they are both models)" distracts from your serious message about discrimination.

Exemplar: When I witness unfair treatment, I speak up by telling others that discrimination is wrong, invite excluded students to join activities, and report serious incidents to teachers who can help address the situation.

#3 (Historical figure response) Strengths:

- Shows personal connection to chosen figure
- Clear reasoning for choice

Weaknesses: Narrow focus  $\rightarrow$  Your response about Cristiano Ronaldo could explore more aspects beyond football skills. The phrase "without a doubt" needs support with stronger reasons why he inspires you.

Exemplar: I would choose to meet Cristiano Ronaldo because his determination to succeed despite early challenges in life inspires me. I would ask him about how he developed his incredible work ethic and maintained focus while facing obstacles.

■ Your answers would benefit from more specific examples and deeper reflection. For the first question, try explaining exactly how participating in discussions helps create a better learning environment. When discussing unfair treatment, share concrete examples of how you've helped others feel included. For the historical figure question, expand on how Ronaldo's mindset could help you in your own life beyond football.

Overall Score: 38/50

### Section 2:
