Section 1:

Strengths:

Strengths:

Strengths:

• Touching metaphor comparing carpet to a parent figure

• Shows the carpet's caring nature effectively

Exemplar: Like a wise father to humanity, it nourished civilisations through the ages, its magical threads weaving protection and guidance into the fabric of our world.

Section 1:

Strengths:

- Your vivid description creates a strong atmospheric setting

Weakness: Lack of spatial clarity \rightarrow Your description jumps between the room and atmosphere without establishing a clear physical layout. The phrase "bearing on the shoulders of the room" creates confusion about what you're trying to convey.

- Clear identification of two major community issues
- Shows consideration for long-term solutions

Weakness: Limited Development of Ideas → Your response would benefit from specific details about how you would implement health training practices and housing solutions. The current answer lacks concrete examples of what these educational programmes would entail.

Exemplar: I would use the funds to establish permanent housing facilities through partnerships with local councils, alongside developing comprehensive health education programmes focused on nutrition, exercise, and preventive care.

#2 "My first steps towards handling a conflict with a classmate or teammate..." Strengths:

- Includes a relevant personal example
- Demonstrates logical problem-solving approach

Weakness: Incomplete Resolution Process \rightarrow Your conflict resolution approach could be enhanced by mentioning specific communication techniques and steps taken to reach the compromise. The example provided doesn't share details about the actual conversation process.

Exemplar: During our project discussion, I actively listened to my classmate's perspective, asked clarifying questions about their ideas, and suggested we combine elements from both our proposals to create a stronger final concept.

- Shows enthusiasm for the subject
- Includes practical teaching methods

Weakness: Surface-Level Lesson Planning → Your teaching plan would be stronger with more specific details about the interactive robot-building activity and how you would engage students of different skill levels

Exemplar: For our hands-on activity, students would work in pairs to build a simple wheeled robot, programming it to navigate an obstacle course while learning about sensors and basic coding concepts.

Focus on expanding your responses with concrete details that showcase your thinking process.
