Section 1:

Strengths:

Strengths:

- Engaging opening that creates mystery and intrigue

Exemplar: Every night at midnight, like clockwork, the stars above the village would vanish for one full minute, plunging everything into darkness as if someone had flicked off the only light in a room.

#2: "Despite their elegance, the stars always seemed to mutter mysterious words convincing Liam he didn't truly understand their purpose."

Strengths:

- Creative personification of stars
- Good use of sensory details

Weakness: Underdeveloped character connection \rightarrow Your description of Liam's interaction with the stars needs more emotional depth. The phrase "mutter mysterious words" could be expanded to show how these words affect Liam personally.

Exemplar: The elegant stars whispered secrets that haunted Liam's thoughts, leaving him desperate to understand their hidden message.

Strengths:

• Good build-up of tension

■ Your story presents an intriguing mystery but needs deeper exploration of Liam's emotional journey. Try adding more details about how the stars' behaviour affects his daily life and relationships. You could strengthen the conflict between Liam's curiosity and his father's practical mindset by showing specific examples of how this affects their relationship.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the third paragraph focusing on a specific memory between Liam and his father that shows their different views about the stars.

- Personal example effectively illustrates curiosity and initiative
- Clear connection between curiosity and real-world application

Weakness: Limited depth in exploring learning strategies → Your piece focuses mainly on curiosity but could delve deeper into other aspects of being a good student. The phrase "will ask questions about what to do" needs more context about specific learning approaches and study habits.

I demonstrate good study habits by actively participating in class discussions, maintaining organised notes, and setting aside dedicated time for independent research. My curiosity about AI led me to create a structured learning plan, combining classroom knowledge with additional resources.

#2 From "I have a strong urge..." to "...isn't privileged for certain people." Strengths:

- Shows thoughtful approach to conflict resolution
- Demonstrates responsibility and empathy

Weakness: Lack of specific examples \rightarrow Your response would be stronger with a concrete situation where you helped someone. The phrase "help them confront the bully" needs more detail about how you would safely and effectively do this.

Last term, when I noticed a Year 7 student being repeatedly excluded during lunch breaks, I approached them kindly and invited them to join our study group. This helped create a supportive environment whilst alerting teachers to the situation.

#3 From "I would want to meet Marie Curie..." to "...path she took." Strengths:

- Shows good knowledge of the historical figure
- Questions demonstrate genuine interest

Weakness: Surface-level questioning \rightarrow Your questions could dig deeper into Marie Curie's scientific methods and research process. The phrase "how she had excelled at two difficult subjects" could explore more specific aspects of her work.

I would be particularly interested in understanding how you developed your pioneering radioactivity research methods despite limited resources, and what specific challenges you faced in your early experiments with polonium.

■ Your answers show good understanding but need more detailed examples and deeper analysis. Try to expand your responses by including specific situations from your own experience. When discussing historical figures, connect their achievements more directly to your own interests and aspirations. Make your responses longer by adding more personal reflections and concrete examples.
