## WRITING PIECE 1 - FEEDBACK

### Section 1:

#1 "On the last day of summer, Lucas had a peculiar feeling in his gut. It felt like something was dragging him; It called out to him, trying to control him."

# Strengths:

- Strong opening that creates immediate intrigue
- Effective use of sensory details to establish tension

Weakness: Repetitive pronouns → Your repeated use of "him" in quick succession weakens the impact. The phrase "It called out to him, trying to control him" could be more powerful with varied sentence structure.

# His feeling pulled at his chest, its ghostly whispers attempting to take control.

#2 "The warm sun hung low, its weightless particles touching the sparkling sea, as the sea water was painted by the fluorescent colours of an endless sunset."

# Strengths:

- Beautiful imagery of the sunset
- Creative use of personification

Weakness: Overcomplicated description → Your description includes too many elements at once. The phrase "weightless particles" alongside "fluorescent colours" makes the imagery feel cluttered rather than focused.

# Strengths:

- Good build-up of supernatural elements
- Clear transition into fantasy elements

Weakness: Rushed pacing  $\rightarrow$  Your quick jump from hearing sounds to the portal's appearance needs more development. The phrase "but ignored them" diminishes the tension you've built.

■ Your narrative shows promise in creating an atmospheric fantasy scene. You could strengthen the story by developing Lucas's emotional journey more deeply. When he discovers the bottle and scroll, take time to show his inner thoughts and feelings. Adding more detail about why he feels compelled to read the scroll would help readers connect with his choices.

Actionable task: Rewrite the paragraph where Lucas finds the bottle, focusing on his emotional response and internal dialogue as he debates whether to open it.

### Section 1:

#1 (First paragraph): Strengths:

- Creates an intriguing premise with precise timing detail
- Establishes mystery through unique astronomical phenomenon

Weakness: Limited context development → Your opening would benefit from setting up why this phenomenon is significant to the village. The phrase "It was like a break for the stars" needs more foundation to support this interpretation.

Exemplar: Each night at midnight, the stars above our remote village performed their mysterious disappearing act - a phenomenon that had captivated me since childhood.

#2 (Second paragraph): Strengths:

- Rich sensory details with moonlight imagery
- Effective use of time element to build tension

Weakness: Disconnected imagery  $\rightarrow$  Your descriptions of moonlight creating "natural aroma" don't connect logically. The phrase "emotions pouring out onto the air" needs clearer connection to the scene's atmosphere.

Exemplar: The moonlight bathed my bedroom in an ethereal glow, casting silver shadows across my blanket as my digital clock blinked towards midnight.

#3 (Final paragraph): Strengths:

- Strong character motivation
- Introduces meaningful stakes

Weakness: Rushed revelation  $\rightarrow$  Your conclusion jumps too quickly to global significance. The phrase "in the entire eight billion people" needs more build-up to justify why Liam feels personally chosen.

Exemplar: Something about these vanishing stars spoke directly to me - a message I couldn't ignore, even if I was the only one in our village who noticed.

■ Your narrative presents an engaging concept about cosmic mystery and personal destiny. To deepen your story's impact, try developing why this star phenomenon matters specifically to your village and Liam's place within it. You could strengthen the connection between the physical event and its deeper meaning by showing how it affects daily village life.

Actionable task: Rewrite the final paragraph focusing on building a clearer progression from local significance to global importance, showing specific ways the star phenomenon has changed Liam's understanding of his role.

Score: 40/50

#### Section 1:

#1 (First paragraph about being a good student) Strengths:

- Powerful use of metaphors like "obstacles crash onto them like lightning"
- Strong emphasis on resilience and self-awareness

Weakness: Limited connection between ideas  $\rightarrow$  Your ideas jump from resilience to self-awareness to curiosity without clear links. For example, you mention "Self-awareness is key" but don't explain how it connects to being a good student.

Exemplar: A good student demonstrates resilience by bouncing back from challenges while maintaining their humility. This self-awareness helps them develop both inner peace and the confidence to pursue their curiosities.

#2 (Response about unfair treatment) Strengths:

- Clear step-by-step approach to handling the situation
- Good balance between direct intervention and seeking help

Weakness: Lack of specific examples  $\rightarrow$  Your response would be stronger with real-life examples. You mention "small yet powerful words" but only give two basic examples.

Exemplar: When I see someone being bullied, I might say "I understand how you feel" and offer to sit with them at lunch, showing support through both words and actions.

#3 (Leonardo Da Vinci answer) Strengths:

- Shows genuine interest in the historical figure
- Makes connection to modern relevance

Weakness: Surface-level exploration  $\rightarrow$  Your response touches briefly on Da Vinci's achievements but doesn't dig deeper into why his specific innovations interest you.

Exemplar: I would ask Da Vinci about his flying machine designs and how his observations of birds influenced his understanding of aerodynamics, as this shows how his curiosity led to groundbreaking innovations.

■ Your answers show good thinking but need more personal examples and deeper exploration. For the Da Vinci response, you could mention specific inventions that fascinate you. In the fairness scenario, include a real situation you've handled. When describing a good student, connect your ideas with clear transitions to build a stronger argument.

#### Section 2:

#1 Being a good student goes deeper in definition then [than] having excellent grades and being kind to many people.
