WRITING PIECE 1 - FEEDBACK

Section 1:

#1: "The wind whispered through the beach, scattering the grains of sand in a swirling flurry, while carrying the salty scent of sea." Strengths:

- Vivid sensory details that create a strong visual image

- Creates suspense about the note's contents
- Direct action that moves the story forward

Weakness: Underdeveloped moment of discovery \rightarrow Your writing rushes through this key moment. The words "dumped out" downplay the importance of finding the mysterious note.

Exemplar: With trembling fingers, Lucas twisted the bottle's cork free, carefully sliding out the weathered note that promised untold secrets.

Section 1:

- Shows character's physical state effectively

- Memorable closing line

Exemplar: That night, Liam's mind buzzed with possibilities—were the stars sending him a message, or was there something more sinister at work in the quiet village?

Actionable Task: Rewrite the final paragraph focusing on Liam's specific theories about the stars' disappearance and include at least two concrete actions he plans to take to investigate this mystery.

#1 (First paragraph on being a good student) Strengths:

- Shows understanding of both academic and personal growth aspects
- Makes meaningful connections between asking questions and learning

Weakness: Limited development of ideas \rightarrow Your writing touches on important points but doesn't delve deeper into specific examples. When you mention "striving to improve," you could strengthen this by sharing concrete ways students demonstrate this quality.

Exemplar: Being a good student means having the courage to raise your hand and ask "why?" when concepts seem unclear, and supporting classmates who might be struggling with similar questions.

#2 (Paragraph about unfair treatment) Strengths:

- Demonstrates thoughtful approach to conflict resolution
- Shows consideration for others' autonomy

Weakness: Lack of specific scenarios → Your response would benefit from a real-life example. When you write "try to protect them," you could elaborate on specific actions you would take.

Exemplar: When I noticed a younger student being excluded from games during break time, I invited them to join our group and encouraged others to welcome new friends.

#3 (Meeting historical figure) Strengths:

- Clear reasoning for choosing MLK Jr.
- Shows understanding of historical significance

Weakness: Surface-level questioning \rightarrow Your questions could dig deeper into MLK Jr.'s philosophy. The phrase "what advice he would give" is broad and could be more specific to current civil rights issues.

Exemplar: I would ask Martin Luther King Jr. about his vision of peaceful resistance and how we could apply his principles of non-violent protest to address modern-day inequality in our schools and communities.

■ Your writing shows good awareness of important values and principles. You could strengthen your responses by including more personal experiences and specific examples to support your ideas. Try to draw deeper connections between your thoughts and real-world applications. Your

answers would benefit from more detailed exploration of how these concepts apply to everyday situations.

Actionable task: Rewrite your response about unfair treatment by including a specific example from your own experience, focusing on the exact steps you took to address the situation.

Section 2:

#1 What does being a good student mean to you?: To me, being a good student means willingness [having the willingness] to ask questions when you need help.
