Section 1:

- Vivid sensory details through colour choices
- Strong imagery with mystical elements

Weakness: Missing punctuation and flow \rightarrow Your opening sentence needs proper punctuation between clauses. "with it" disrupts the flow and creates confusion. The multiple clauses make the sentence harder to follow.

Exemplar: The carpet lay there with its intricate purple and orange patterns, revealing its mystical secrets like a confession behind the stitching.

- Good build-up of tension

- Strong ending with mystery
- Good contrast between action and stillness

Weakness: Underdeveloped resolution \rightarrow Your ending moves too quickly from action to stillness without showing the transition. The final image needs more detail to feel complete.

Exemplar: The carpet releases me with one final violent thrust. As I lay gasping, it settles back into stillness, but I can feel its magic sinking deep within my mind, a weight I know I'll never forget.

■ Your piece creates an intriguing magical scenario, but you could develop the sensory details further. The carpet's magical nature needs more specific details about how it feels, sounds, and looks. You might also expand on the protagonist's emotional journey from curiosity to fear. Consider adding more details about the magical words and their effect on both the carpet and the character.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the scene focusing on the physical sensations and emotions when touching the carpet, making sure to include at least three specific details about how the magic feels.

Section 1:

Strengths:

- Strong sensory details with "trembling hands" and "shaking so hard" that build tension
- Creative use of sound effect "Boom!" to create immediacy

Weakness: Unclear sequence of events \rightarrow Your writing jumps between actions without showing how they connect. The sudden "Boom!" and Aiden's reaction need more context to help readers understand what's happening.

Strengths:

- Good emotion shown through dialogue

Strengths:

- Clear contrast between Daniel's friendliness and the scary monsters

Weakness: Rushed ending \rightarrow Your writing ends abruptly without showing what happens next or why the monsters run at Aiden.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the ending scene focusing on describing what the monsters look like in detail and showing Aiden's emotional and physical reactions when he sees them.

#1 Spending money on homes and food (Q1) Strengths:

- Shows compassion and understanding of basic human needs
- Clear prioritisation of spending decisions

Weakness: Limited detail in implementation \rightarrow Your answer would benefit from specific details about how you would execute these plans. The phrase "building homes for the poor" needs more depth about the location, type of homes, and how you would identify those in need.

Exemplar: I would allocate the money to build affordable housing estates in areas with high homelessness rates, partnering with local councils to ensure the homes reach those most in need.

#2 Conflict resolution approach (Q2) Strengths:

- Shows willingness to listen to others
- Demonstrates awareness of others' feelings

Weakness: Lack of concrete resolution steps \rightarrow Your response focuses on listening but doesn't outline what happens after hearing both sides. The phrase "it is easiest to talk than argue" needs to be followed by specific steps you would take to reach a solution.

Exemplar: After listening to both sides, I would suggest we find common ground and work together to create a solution that addresses both of our concerns.

#3 Teaching Minecraft (Q3) Strengths:

- Shows enthusiasm for the subject
- Recognises educational value in gaming

Weakness: Inappropriate mention of anger management \rightarrow Your inclusion of "kill enemies to let out anger" is not suitable for a teaching context. The focus should be on the educational benefits of Minecraft rather than personal emotional release.

Exemplar: I would teach Minecraft because it develops problem-solving skills through building structures and managing resources, while encouraging students to work together on creative projects.

■ Your answers would benefit from more professional and detailed responses. While you show good intentions, try to frame your answers in ways that highlight your practical skills and

maturity. For example, in your charity work answer, consider adding specific plans and outcomes. When discussing conflict resolution, include concrete steps for reaching agreements. For teaching, focus on learning outcomes rather than personal enjoyment.

Actionable task: Rewrite your answer about teaching Minecraft, focusing on three specific learning objectives you would help students achieve during your lesson. Also, try expanding your answers and add more specific details/examples. You can do it!
