#2 (Second answer - Unfair treatment) Strengths:

Weakness: Vague action steps  $\rightarrow$  Your answer would benefit from specific examples of intervention. The phrase "speak up and advocate" needs more detail about how you would actually help someone in this situation.

Exemplar: "Last week, I saw a younger student being left out during lunch. I invited them to join my table and introduced them to my friends, demonstrating how small actions can make someone feel included."

#3 (Third answer - Historical figure) Strengths:

- Shows genuine interest in the subject
- Well-structured reasoning for choice

Weakness: One-dimensional focus  $\rightarrow$  Your answer centres mainly on da Vinci's creative process without exploring other fascinating aspects of his life and work. The question "How do you nurture curiosity" could be expanded to include more specific areas of interest.

Exemplar: "I would ask da Vinci about his innovative flying machine designs and how his artistic skills influenced his engineering projects, as these show the unique way he combined different fields of study."

■ Your answers show good thought process but need more personal touch. Try adding real-life examples from your own experiences to make your responses more memorable. Your answers could be longer - aim to include at least one specific example in each response. Remember that interviewers want to know about you, not just your ideas.
