Section 1:

Section 1:

- Vivid imagery of the stars disappearing
- Strong opening that creates intrigue

Weakness: Redundant sequence description \rightarrow Your writing repeats similar ideas with "one by one" and "each beginning." This makes the sentence feel cluttered. The phrase "jaw dropping awe" also feels disconnected from the deeper emotion of the moment.

Exemplar: As Liam hung off his roof of weathered wood planks, he watched in wonder as the stars slowly faded into the horizon.

#2 "The shimmering golden rim and the diamond plated fingers made even Rolexes look poor." Strengths:

- Effective contrast between Liam's poverty and the watch's luxury
- Strong descriptive details of the watch

Weakness: Limited context development \rightarrow Your writing jumps into describing the watch's grandeur without establishing its significance to Liam or the story. The comparison to Rolexes feels sudden without proper build-up.

- Creates a surreal atmosphere

Strengths:

- Clear structure with three main qualities defined
- Good use of personal voice showing reflection

Weaknesses: Lack of specific examples \rightarrow You mention responsibility shows "inner integrity" but don't provide real situations where this happens in school. The ideas need more depth with concrete examples from your own experience.

I demonstrated responsibility when I admitted to accidentally breaking a beaker in science class, even though no one saw me do it. This showed my integrity because I chose to be honest despite facing consequences.

#2: "When I see someone being treated unfairly, I always try to stand up for them..."

Strengths:

- Shows good judgment in handling different situations
- Demonstrates awareness of when to seek help

Weaknesses: Limited development of ideas \rightarrow You could expand on specific ways you've stood up for others and what exactly you say or do. The response would be stronger with real examples from your experience.

Last week, when I saw some students making fun of James's accent, I spoke up and said "It's not okay to mock how someone speaks. We should celebrate our different backgrounds instead."

#3: "If I had to meet a historical figure, I would definitely meet Steve Jobs..."

Strengths:

- Well-structured with clear questions
- Shows knowledge of the subject

Weaknesses: Surface-level reasoning \rightarrow Your questions could dig deeper into Jobs' leadership style, decision-making process, and vision for technology. The current questions stay quite basic.

I would ask: "What specific leadership qualities helped you transform Apple from a garage startup into a global technology leader?"

■ Your answers would be more compelling with specific examples from your own life. When you talk about being responsible or kind, share real situations where you showed these qualities. Your Steve Jobs response could explore more meaningful questions about innovation and leadership rather than just product improvements. Try to write longer responses that really show your character and experiences.
