# WRITING PIECE 1 - FEEDBACK

### Section 1:

- Creates immediate intrigue with the mysterious discovery
- Sets up a clear scene with specific details

Weakness: Limited sensory details  $\rightarrow$  Your opening could benefit from describing how Lucas found the jar and his initial reaction. The phrase "buried in the sand" leaves room for more engaging details about the discovery moment.

Exemplar: On the last day of summer, Lucas' fingers brushed against something smooth while digging in the warm sand. His heart raced as he pulled out a glass jar, inside which lay a message written in strange symbols he had never seen before.

#2 "Lucas, thinking that cleaning the jar and his room was going to be easy, said, 'Sure thing, Mom.' Excited, he ran off, cleaned the jar, and went into his room" Strengths:

- Shows Lucas' personality through his optimistic attitude
- Includes realistic dialogue

Weakness: Rushed pacing  $\rightarrow$  Your writing moves too quickly through Lucas cleaning the jar. The phrase "cleaned the jar, and went into his room" skips over what could be an interesting moment of Lucas examining his treasure.

Exemplar: Lucas confidently agreed to his mother's terms. After carefully washing away the sand under warm water, he held the gleaming jar up to the light, wondering about its mysterious journey to the beach.

#3 "This is going to be a long day." Lucas said, staring at the mess if a bedroom he had." Strengths:

- Effectively uses dialogue to show Lucas' feelings
- Creates a relatable moment

Weakness: Limited description of the room  $\rightarrow$  Your writing could paint a clearer picture of the messy room. The phrase "mess if a bedroom" needs more specific details about what makes the room messy.

Exemplar: "This is going to be a long day," Lucas ground, surveying his bedroom floor where toy cars, comic books, and building blocks created an obstacle course of clutter.

■ Your story has a promising start with an intriguing discovery, but you could develop the mystery of the message more deeply. Try adding more details about Lucas' thoughts and feelings about the strange writing. You could also build more tension by showing his struggle between wanting to explore the jar's secrets and having to clean his room first.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the scene where Lucas cleans the jar, focusing on his examination of the mysterious message and his thoughts about where it might have come from.

## Section 1:

# Strengths:

- Strong opening hook that creates mystery
- Good use of repetition to show isolation

Weakness: Limited emotional depth  $\rightarrow$  Your writing would benefit from showing Liam's feelings about being dismissed by everyone. The phrase "they called him crazy" could be enhanced by describing his emotional reaction.

Exemplar: When he told his parents and they called him crazy, his heart sank as tears welled up in his eyes.

#2 "His village, content with ignorance, slept easy, but Liam couldn't ignore the truth. His dad said he was chasing his imagination, but Liam wasn't so sure."

# Strengths:

- Nice contrast between village and Liam
- Good build-up of tension

Weakness: Underdeveloped setting  $\rightarrow$  Your description of the village needs more detail. The phrase "content with ignorance" could be expanded to paint a clearer picture of village life.

Exemplar: The tiny village nestled in the valley remained peaceful at night, its cottages dark and silent while Liam lay awake, watching.

#3 "Liam looked back, and saw something. Black eyes. red teeth. And an urge to kill."

# Strengths:

- Effective use of short sentences for impact
- Creates suspense through minimal description

Weakness: Unclear monster description  $\rightarrow$  Your monster needs more specific details. The phrases "black eyes" and "red teeth" don't give readers enough to picture the creature.

Exemplar: Liam looked back and froze. Two hollow black eyes gleamed in the darkness, rows of bloodstained teeth dripping with hunger.

■ Your story has a strong supernatural element that draws readers in. You could make the story more gripping by adding more details about why only Liam can see these events. Try developing the relationship between Liam and his family to show why they don't believe him. You might also want to think about what lies behind that mysterious door at the end.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the scene where Liam encounters the monster, focusing on all five senses to make the experience more vivid and frightening.

#### INTERVIEW

#### Section 1:

#1 (First paragraph) Strengths:

- Shows self-awareness about learning and helping others
- Demonstrates understanding of classroom engagement

Weaknesses: Repetitive ideas → Multiple mentions of "helping others" without developing the concept fully. Your statement "helping others" appears three times without explaining how you specifically assist classmates.

Lack of specific examples → The response would benefit from concrete examples of how you participate in class discussions or help others learn from mistakes.

Exemplar: When I actively contribute to class discussions by asking thoughtful questions and sharing my understanding, I demonstrate genuine interest in learning. Additionally, I help my classmates by explaining concepts I've mastered, especially after learning from my own mistakes.

#2 (Second paragraph) Strengths:

- Provides a clear, specific example
- Shows initiative and problem-solving skills

Weaknesses: Abrupt ending  $\rightarrow$  The conclusion about playing tip seems disconnected from the main point about helping someone being bullied.

Limited reflection  $\rightarrow$  Your response could explore the impact of your actions more deeply, beyond just the immediate outcome.

Exemplar: After helping resolve the bullying situation, I made sure to include the student in our group activities regularly, which helped them feel more welcomed and supported in our class community.

#3 (Third paragraph) Strengths:

- Shows personal connection to the historical figure
- Demonstrates knowledge of the mathematician's background

Weaknesses: Historical accuracy  $\rightarrow$  The statement about Ramanujan being "the first person to discover infinity" needs more precision.

Development of ideas  $\rightarrow$  Your response could elaborate on specific mathematical contributions that inspire you.

Exemplar: I admire how Ramanujan developed groundbreaking mathematical theories despite facing numerous challenges, and I would ask him about how his cultural background influenced his unique approach to mathematics.

■ Your answers show good intentions and personal engagement with the topics. To strengthen your responses, try to develop each point more fully with specific details and examples. When discussing historical figures, focus on their specific achievements and why they matter to you personally. Make your responses longer by explaining the reasoning behind your actions and thoughts.

Score: 39/50

### Section 2:
